## XII. The Book of II Thessalonians

- A. The Authorship of II Thessalonians
- 1. The same patristics who attested to Pauline authorship for the First attest for the Second.
  - 2. Liberals question whether Paul would have written two epistles in such a short time with different content and tone, in spite of Paul's affirmation (1:1; 3:17).
  - B. The Date of II Thessalonians—he apparently wrote within several months (c. AD 51) of the First Epistle (3:11 with I Thes. 4:10-12 ff.).
  - C. The Origin and Destination of II Thessalonians—Paul apparently wrote from Corinth to the same church that he had started over a three week period.
  - D. The Purpose of II Thessalonians
    - 1. He thanked them for their faithfulness (1:1-4).
    - 2. He assured them that the forged letter was theologically incorrect about Christians in the Day of the Lord (2:2).
    - 3. He promised to sign his signature on all letters (3:16-18).
  - E. The Characteristics of II Thessalonians
    - 1. He continued to discuss the return of Christ (1:7-10; 2:1, 8; 3:5).
    - 2. The apostle encouraged the Thessalonians that their enemies and persecutors could very well be cast into the judgment of the Tribulation (1:6 ff.).
- 3. He staunchly warned about a forged letter that taught a Post-Trib rapture position (2:2).<sup>1</sup>
  - 4. He referred to the Day of Christ<sup>2</sup> (I Cor. 1:8; 5:5; Phil. 1:6, 10; 3:16, II Thes. 2:2) indicating that it would begin simultaneously with the Day of the Lord.
  - 5. Paul taught that the Day of the Lord would be characterized by two supernatural phenomena: the revelation of the final Antichrist (I Jn. 2:18) and the realization of the final Apostasy (II Tim. 3:13).
    - a. The Antichrist will oppose and exalt himself with regard to God (2:4).

- b. He is identified as "the man of sin" and "the son of perdition" (2:3).
- c. He will not be revealed until the one Who lets, or the "Restrainer," is removed (6-8).
  - 1) The Restrainer must be more powerful than Satan's Antichrist.
  - 2) The Restrainer must be a member of the Godhead.
  - 3) The Restrainer must be the Holy Spirit because His special indwelling ministry will cease at the Rapture when all those "in Christ" are removed (I Thes. 4:15-17).
  - d. Satan will offer mankind "a lie" ( $\tau \hat{\omega}$ )  $\psi \epsilon \acute{\upsilon} \delta \epsilon \iota$ ), which is the same lie he offered Adam and Eve in the Garden: deathlessness and deification of man (Gen. 3:4-5). He will claim to be the perfect reincarnated man—666 (Rev. 13:18).
  - e. Many during the Tribulation will receive not and believe not the truth and be damned (2:10-12).
  - 6. Some church members apparently gave up employment to wait on Rapture, and in the meanwhile became busybodies (3:6-11).
  - 7. These folks were to be shunned and made ashamed (3:12-15).
