In 2021, there is a strong possibility that national and international shutdowns will continue to be enforced for one reason or another. There is truth in the maxim that "power corrupts" and certainly the rise in incorrigible pipsqueak dictators affirms this saying. Moreover, it has been heard from more than one pastor the bold and pious sounding assertion that "if any authority denies me privilege to preach in 'the name of Jesus,' then in the time of local/national shutdown will I obey the Lord and not Caesar!" To the protestantized Baptist pastor who was never taught ecclesiology 101 in one of the many para-church Bible colleges and seminaries, from whence he may have received "preacher-boy" training, Caesar has already denied this privilege! To deny the assembly from assembling is to deny preaching in 'the name of Jesus'! The LORD's name is attached to His divinely designated place of worship! Moses declared this truth, saying, "But unto the place which the LORD your God shall choose out of all your tribes to put his name there, even unto his habitation shall ye seek, and thither thou shalt come" (Dt. 12:5). Again, "Then there shall be a place which the LORD your God shall choose to cause his name to dwell there; thither shall ye bring all that I command you; your burnt offerings, and your sacrifices, your tithes, and the heave offering of your hand, and all your choice yows which ye yow unto the LORD" (Dt. 12:11; cf. also 12:21; 14:23-24; 16:2, 6, 11; 26:2).

'The name of Jesus' is attached to the assembly of baptized believers gathered together to carry out church discipline. The Lord Jesus said, "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Mt. 18:20; cf. vv. 17-19). The Apostle Paul asserted that church discipline was done in the name of Jesus Christ, saying, "In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, when ye are gathered together, and my spirit, with the power of our Lord Jesus Christ" (I Cor. 5:4) and "Now we command you, brethren, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye withdraw yourselves from every brother that walketh disorderly, and not after the tradition which he received of us" (II Thes. 3:6). The Great Commission for Baptist church planting is done in the

name of the Triune God, including baptizing in 'the name of Jesus,' as the Lord demanded, saying "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (Mt. 28:19-20), and Luke noted, saying, "For as yet he was fallen upon none of them: only they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 8:16), and "And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord. Then prayed they him to tarry certain days" (Acts 10:48), and "When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 19:5). Church teaching is done in 'the name of Jesus,' as Luke revealed, saying, "Saying, Did not we straitly command you that ye should not teach in this name? and, behold, ye have filled Jerusalem with your doctrine, and intend to bring this man's blood upon us" (Acts 5:28). 'The name of Jesus' is attached to serving the Lord in the assembly as Paul affirmed, saying, "And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him" (Col. 3:17). 'The name of Jesus' is attached to the assembly when she corporately calls on the name of the Lord in prayer, as Paul revealed, saying, "Unto the church of God which is at Corinth, to them that are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, with all that in every place call upon the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, both theirs and ours" (I Cor. 1:2). 'The name of Jesus' is attached to the elders in the church anointing the sick, as James stated, saying, "Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord" (Jam. 5:14). 'The name of Jesus' is attached to open-door missions, as John revealed, saying, "I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name" (Rev. 3:8).

Is there any expectation for those pastors who will not assemble (during COVID-19 [2.0]) in the place where the Lord has put His name to preach in **'the name of Jesus'** in any scenario? Preaching in **'The name of Jesus'** biblically cannot be disassociated from assembling in the assembled assembly!




