ALL HAVE SINNED

"For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." **ROMANS 3:23**

There is no question about it - we've all sinned, and we all know it. Some may not want to acknowledge that they have sinned, but we know better. Each of us have

recognized from time to time our shortcomings and our failures when it comes to keeping God's commandments. And that is what sin is. Sin is missing the mark or the goal that God has given to us. The Ten Commandments of Exodus chapter twenty, like a road sign, tell us that we are breaking the Law of God and missing the mark, which He has given to us. "There is none that doeth good, no not one" (Romans 3:12).

The problem is - when we think of being a sinner, we like to compare ourselves to other fallible and sinful men. We can always find someone who is a greater sinner than ourselves. By comparing ourselves to the greater sinner, we are able somehow to justify ourselves as not being too bad. It makes us feel better and soothes the harsh reality of sin. The Bible tells us, "There are many devises in a man's heart; nevertheless the counsel of the Lord, that shall stand" (Proverbs 19:21). God says, we are sinners, and that is the truth. "Every way of man is right in his own eyes: but the Lord pondereth the hearts" (Proverbs 21:2). No matter how we sugar coat our sin, we know the Lord still knows the truth and reality of our hearts.


Now, rather than comparing ourselves to other sinful men, let us compare ourselves to God. Let us receive the truth of God that we have "...come short of the glory of God." That's right, we have come short of God's glory, not the glory of another sinful man. It is the devil, and not God, who would have us compare ourselves wrongly with other fallible men. The devil does this because he abides "not in the truth, [and] because there is no truth in him" (John 8:44). Remember, what he did to Eve in the garden? Do not fall into the same trap! God will only help those which recognize and confess their sinful condition. Sinful man must acknowledge the warning of God in order to receive the mercy of God, "He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy" (Proverbs 28:13).-CAR

Who is Watching?

Read Ruth 1

Ruth 1:1 "Now it came to pass in the days when the judges ruled, that there was a famine in the land..."

Reflection: Have you noticed that often times the Lord tests the faith of His people in trials? There have been many famines in our Biblical history and perhaps in our future. How would you handle it? Do you try to escape trials? Often times that can make matters worse.

Naomi's husband tried to escape his problems but after he passed, Naomi decided to return to the land of the LORD and His people. Did her family have a positive influence on her daughters-in-law? Orpah decided to stay with the ways of the pagans and their false gods but Ruth, on the other hand, seemed to have put her faith in the God of Naomi.

Ruth 1:14 And they lifted up their voice, and wept again: and Orpah kissed her mother in law; but Ruth clave unto her.

Ruth 1:15 And she said, Behold, thy sister in law is gone back unto her people, and unto her gods: return thou after thy sister in law.

Ruth 1:16 And Ruth said, Intreat me not to leave thee, or to return from following after thee: for whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God:

The unsaved are watching the choices we make, the things we do, and the things we say. But who else is watching: Our children are watching, new converts are watching, our extended families are watching. Will your testimony and decisions bring others closer to the Lord or away from Him? Will your choices be an example of godly living?

Is it possible that Elimelech the patriarch of this family, by his choice to move, affected the spiritual condition of his family? Maybe Orpah would not have been drawn into the paganism of this land to follow after false gods. Perhaps the two sons would have led their families in the ways of the LORD.

Challenge: What can you identify with in this account? Are you more like Orpah or Ruth? Are you allured by the world and its shiny temptations or are you faithfully walking in the ways of the Lord? Will you pray and trust Him with your circumstances?

Is there someone in your life that sets a godly example for you to follow? Today, let them know, it will be an encouragement to them!


