## THE BINDING AND LOOSING OF SATAN"



"The Binding and Loosing of Satan" and the **New Testament** Dr. Thomas M. Strouse

#### Introduction

The Pentecostal-Charismatic movement has been trans-denominational since its modern inception (c. 1900) even impacting some fundamental and independent Baptist churches. From time to time some Baptist churches have received the infection of pernicious doctrines such the expression "the binding and loosing of Satan/demons." Common to both the Pentecostal-Charismatic movement and others has been the erroneous sentiment that the supernatural activity by the apostles and believers during the Apostolic Era of the first century is still valid, expected, and sought. For example, the expression "I bind you, Satan, in the name of Jesus" finds usage in some of these groups from the pulpit within the services. Some Baptist churches Cor. 1:22; see also Jn. 4:48; 20:30; Acts 2:19, add this expression and practice to their "arsenal of defense" against the kingdom of darkness and have their own version of

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"deliverance ministries." On the surface<sup>1</sup>, certainly many Christians would hesitate to address the supernatural realm, especially the chief of the supernatural realm, and for good reason since the archangel Michael succinctly retorted the Devil with "the Lord rebuke thee" (Jude 1:9). A brief examination of Scripture will show that "the signs of an apostle" (II Cor. 12:12) ceased with the termination of the apostolate which cessation was co-terminus with the completion of the New Testament Canon (27 NT books). Therefore, the authority to continue the supernatural signs and wonders of the Apostolic age, especially with the so-called "deliverance ministries" of exorcizing demons and supposedly binding Satan, has ceased, and the practices should not be attempted.

#### The Termination of the Apostolate

Since the Jews required a sign, as Paul recorded, saying, "For the Jews require a sign, and the Greeks seek after wisdom" (I

Macchia in his analysis of Pentecostal Theology, saying, "Yet Pentecostals must be cautious about the place they give to the demonic in their healing ministries and theologies and not follow the fascination with the demonic realm so prevalent in contemporary culture. 'Deliverance ministries' sometimes place such a focus on the demonic that deliverance is more a matter of possessing hidden knowledge of the demonic realm...than of the victory of Christ through the Spirit. Demons are named, located, categorized, and bound through elaborate prayers. Yet the development of such esoteric knowledge and activity with regard to the demonic cannot be found in the Scriptures." 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22, 43; Rom. 15:19; I Cor. 14:22; Heb. 2:4)<sup>2</sup>, the Lord has manifested many signs for His chosen people throughout their history. An early example occurred with Moses, as Scripture revealed, saying, "And the LORD said furthermore unto him, Put now thine hand into thy bosom. And he put his hand into his bosom: and when he took it out, behold, his hand was leprous as snow. And he said, Put thine hand into thy bosom again. And he put his hand into his bosom again; and plucked it out of his bosom, and, behold, it was turned again as his other flesh. And it shall come to pass, if they will not believe thee, neither hearken to the voice of the first sign, that they will believe the *voice of the latter sign*" (Ex. 4:6-8; see also Jn. 3:2; Acts 2:22). To be sure, the supernatural is replete throughout the Bible, but in the history of Israel the Scripture gives four major periods of supernatural signs and wonders. 1) Initially, under the leadership of Moses the LORD gave signs and wonders to this newlycovenanted nation. 2) Later when His people went into apostasy, Jehovah raised up His servants the prophets, especially two, namely Elijah and Elisha, to perform outstanding miracles to arrest the attention of apostate kings. 3) With the First Coming of Christ the Lord God performed many signs and miracles to demonstrate His Messiahship, and as manifested on Pentecost, His new day (Sunday not Saturday) in His new place (local church not Temple) about His final sacrifice (Christ's not animals'). He employed signs and wonders through His apostles and disciples in the Apostolic Age of the

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first century. 4) With the Second Coming of Christ (initiated with the Rapture and culminating with the Revelation of Christ at the conclusion of the Tribulation and the outset of Millennium) the Lord God will display great signs and wonders to offset the Antichrist's supernaturalism, as well as to confirm revelatory truth (Rev. 11:5-6; 13:14; 14:6; see Joel 2:28).

To be sure, the Lord Jesus Christ authorized His apostles with supernatural power as Matthew recorded, saying, "These twelve Jesus sent forth, and commanded them, saying, Go not into the way of the Gentiles, and into any city of the Samaritans enter ye not: But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And as ye go, preach, saying, The kingdom of heaven is at hand. Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out devils: freely ye have received, freely give" (Mt. 10:5-8). Later, He sent out the seventy with power over the "devils" through the Lord's name (Lk. 10:1-17). This supernatural power for apostles and disciples finds examples in the book of Acts as the Lord's new institution of the Baptist assembly began to flourish with many churches throughout the Mediterranean basin. The Messiah Jesus of Nazareth fulfilled the great Servant prophecy of Isaiah 61:1-2 as Luke recorded (Lk. 4:18-21). The Lord and those identified with Him gained the attention of the Jewish world with miraculous signs and wonders as John revealed, saying, "And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his

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disciples, which are not written in this book: 31 But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name" (Jn. 20:30-31). However, in due time the Lord Jesus Christ died and his apostles began to expire. James was the first to die and his brother John was the last, with Peter and Paul dying in between. Albeit the Lord gave several temporary offices to the assembly, as Paul declared, saying, "And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers" (Eph. 4:11), only the offices of bishop and deacon continued (I Tim. 3:1 ff. and v. 8 ff.). In the end Paul told Pastor Timothy to do the work of an evangelist.

The apostle Paul claimed he had divine power, saying, "Truly the signs of an apostle were wrought among you in all patience, in signs, and wonders, and mighty deeds" (II Cor. 12:12). Obviously, "the signs of an apostle" belonged exclusively to the apostle. When he was gone so were the signs! Although Paul laid hands on and healed the father of Publius (Acts 28:8), his apostolic power seemed to wane later in life as he could not heal Timothy (I Tim. 5:23), Trophimus (II Tim. 4:20), or even himself (II Cor. 12:7-9). The characteristics of the miracles of the Lord Jesus and the apostles/ disciples included the fact that they were miraculous in their timing

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(instantaneous), **permanence** (no relapses) and **scope** (various afflictions and diseases).<sup>3</sup> Although it is thrilling to read about the supernatural activity during apostolic age as recorded in the Gospels and Acts, especially with the healing the sick, cleansing the lepers, raising the dead,<sup>4</sup> casting out demons, speaking in tongues, etc., these all came to an end with the termination of the apostolate.

#### The Completion of the New Testament Canon

Co-terminus with the termination of the apostolate was the completion of the NT Canon. The Apostle John wrote the last canonical Scripture, the Apocalypse, sometime presumably shortly before his demise. He finished the canon and then died. The Apostle Paul clearly revealed that Jehovah's final revelation came through the divine Son of God, the Lord Jesus Christ, stating, "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds" (Heb. 1:1-2). God established the Son's new revelatory truth, which became the inscripturated Gospels and the Apostle's Doctrine, by signs and wonders. Again, Paul revealed this truth,

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saying, "How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation; which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed unto us by them that heard him; God also bearing them witness, both with signs and wonders, and with divers miracles, and gifts of the Holy Ghost, according to his own will?" (Heb. 2:3-4). The Lord God "confirmed" (bebaioo = to establish, verify) with signs and wonders the Lord Jesus' spoken words of which many became the inspired words of the NT Canon (e.g., Jn. 16:13; Rev. 1:1 and 19).

Mark revealed the same truth, saying, "And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover...And they went forth, and preached every where, the Lord working with them, and **confirming** the word with signs following. Amen." (Mk. 16:17-18, 20). The Lord was "confirming" (bebaioo) the preaching and teaching of the apostles and disciples, many of whose messages became the inscripturated "word" (logos)—NT Canon (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Peter, Paul, James, etc.), with the supernatural activity of casting out of demons (Acts 16:16-18), of speaking in tongues (Acts 2:4; 10:46; 19:6), of handling snakes (Acts 28:3-6), of drinking poison, and of healing the sick (Acts 5:12-15). Once the NT Canon was completed, there was no more need, expectation, or experience of this

supernatural activity<sup>5</sup>. Mark's theological truth received biblical augmentation from the Apostle Paul, who stated, saying, "Charity never faileth: but whether there be prophecies, they shall fail; whether there be tongues, they shall cease; whether there be knowledge, it shall vanish away. For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect is come, then that which is in part shall be done away. When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away childish things. For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known" (I Cor. 13:8-8). This passage teaches several truths. 1. Certain media for divine communication would cease. 2. There was a temporal transition from partial to complete revelatory truth (i.e., the Apostolic Age). 3. This transition is evinced with the examples of a child growing into manhood and a dark mirror becoming illuminated. 4. Biblical theology, such as anthropology, is progressive, moving from partial knowledge about oneself to complete knowledge about all of the doctrine of man. Once the Apostle John finished the Apocalypse, he stated that divine revelation in the written NT Canon was the final and complete authority with no

5 In the post-Apostolic Age the Lord still does perform supernatural activity such as the regeneration of the repentant sinner. However, He does not need to authenticate His working with signs and wonders because the Scripture is the final authority and authenticator on all supernatural activity, since it *"is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart"* (Heb. 4:12). possibility of change. He warned, saying, "For I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophecy of this book, If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book: 19 And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the b things which are written in this book" (Rev. 22:18-19).




#### BBTS SPRING LECTURE SERIES "Understanding of the Times"

# PUT ON THE WHOLE ARMOUR OF GOD



#### PUT ON THE WHOLE ARMOUR OF GOD

There is no question from the Bible that Christian Believers are in a spiritual warfare: Ephesians 6:12:

Dr. Caswell A. Reeves

"For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities (devil and demons), against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." God clearly reveals this is not a warfare with men (flesh and blood), but with the devil and his demons (rulers of the darkness) and with wickedness in the heavens (in high places).

This spiritual warfare requires a different kind of armour than the armour which soldiers wear when fighting men. It requires spiritual armour. Using a soldier motif, the Apostle Paul shares this armour with the church of Ephesus by commanding them to put on the whole armour of God.

The Christian therefore learned he needs to stand in Ephesians 6:14-17: He needs to stand, having his loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness;

And his feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith he shall be

able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked.

And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

This armour is clearly necessary to give the Christian Believer victory over his spiritual adversaries: the devil and his wiles (tricks), and the wicked influences of life that are always tempting a Believer away from righteousness, truth and spiritual living. Have you put on your spiritual armour? -CAR






