## **Bible Baptist Theological Seminary 2018 Fall Lecture Series**



On Friday, November 9, 2018, Bible Baptist Church will host the ninth annual Bible Baptist Theological Seminary Fall Lecture Series entitled "The Theology of Geography: A Pictorial Description of Israel." This will be an effort to use pictures through Dr. Thomas M. Strouse a power-point presentation to

depict significant geographical places in Israel relating to biblical episodes and their theological significance. The pictures were recently taken photographs by Dr. and Mrs. Thomas M. Strouse who have just returned from a ten-day tour of Israel. Some of the locations will include Mount Carmel (site of Elijah's victory over the prophets of Baal), Megiddo (site of the future battle of Armageddon), the Sea of Galilee (place of the Lord's ministry and miracles), the Jordan River (site of John the Baptist's immersion ministry), the Dead Sea (lowest place on the surface of the earth), Engedi (David's cave of hiding), and, of course, Jerusalem. In Jerusalem, the sites will include the Wailing Wall, the Mount of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, Golgotha, and, of course, the site of the empty Tomb. Prayerfully, this presentation will enhance the believer's interest in and appreciation for the LORD's gift of land to His chosen people as revealed in detail in the Scripture. The city of Jerusalem is the most important piece of real estate in all of God's creation, since the Lord said, "This is Jerusalem: I have set it in the midst of the nations and countries that are round about her" (Ezk. 5:5). The Bible Baptist Theological Seminary Lecture Series will be held at the Marriot in Cromwell, CT beginning at 9 AM and ending at 3 PM. Please RSVP the number in your group attending.

One of the sites that Dr. and Mrs. Thomas Strouse saw was Mt. Carmel, which hosted a set of "Carob" trees or "St. John's Bread" trees. Supposedly John the Baptist ate the sweet-tasting seeds from the pods of the carob tree instead of locusts. This is a traditional interpretation coming out of Europe in the Middle Ages but is not based on Scripture. Scripture apparently does refer to carob pods as the diet of the prodigal son, stating, "And he would fain have filled his belly with the husks that the swine did eat: and no man gave unto him" (Lk. 15:16). The Greek word behind "husks" is the plural noun keration ("horns") which may refer to the horn-shaped carob pods, as the inferior NET reads, saying, "He was longing to eat the carob pods the pigs were eating, but no one gave him anything" (loc. cit.). However, the New Testament Scripture does declare twice that John the Baptist ate this Kosher insect (cf. Lev. 11:22), namely the "locust" (akris), saying, "And the same John had his raiment of camel's hair, and a leathern girdle about his loins; and his meat was locusts and wild honey" (Mt. 3:4; see Mk. Moreover, the tetrakis legomena Greek word 1:6). akris for "locust" also occurs in the Apocalypse twice, referring to demon-locusts from the bottomless pit.



The Apostle John revealed, saying, "And there came out of the smoke **locusts** upon the earth: and unto them was given power, as the scorpions of the earth have power...And the shapes of the locusts were like unto horses prepared unto battle; and on their heads were as it were crowns like gold, and their faces were as the faces of men" (Rev. 9:3, 7). Certainly, the loosed creatures from the abyss are not demonic carob pods! The inspired Scriptures state authoritatively, saying, "And John was clothed with camel's hair, and with a girdle of a skin about his loins; and **he did eat locusts** and wild honey" (Mk. 1:6). Other biblical issues will be expanded or clarified in the power-point presentation.



The importance of godliness is reflected in the Christian's forward look. "Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness" (2 Peter 3:11).

Comparing the physical and spiritual exercises of life the Christian is warned and encouraged that "bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come" (1 Timothy 4:8). Revealing the mystery of godliness, the Apostle Paul said, "And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory" (1 Timothy 3:16).

We learn that godliness is in Christ. We conclude that godliness is a Christ-like attitude that causes a Christ-like walk. Do we see that walk in our life? Are we satisfied/content with that walk? Is that great acquisition, godliness, found in our life? CAR

This 12 Week Devotional is a ministry of Bible Baptist Church in Cromwell, CT. It is designed for




