GROOMING IN CHRIST

life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory" (Colossians 3:1-4).

Spiritual grooming is to be Christ-like, which is setting "...your affections on things above." The Apostle Paul said, "Be ye followers of me, even as I also am of Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:1). There is no question, just as Paul groomed himself after Christ, so should we. This can be achieved by doing three things. First, by letting "the peace of God rule in [our] hearts" (Colossians 3:15). We should be governed by God's peace and not our fleeting peace of mind. Second, by being "thankful" (v.15). Note, if we can't see a reason to be

we have taken the first step in backsliding. Therefore, we should look for what Christ is doing in our life and be thankful. Third, by letting "the word of Christ dwell in [us] richly" (Colossians 3:17). Our relationship with God's Word, we are told should be rich. And as riches are cherished, so ought the Scripture be with us. Speaking of the wisdom of the Word, Solomon said, "She is more precious than rubies: and all the things thou canst desire are not to be compared unto her" (Proverbs 3:15).

The achievement of spiritual grooming is seen in "whatsoever [we] do in word or deed" that it is done in concert with Christ our Savior. It is done on our part with his authority and with an attitude of gratefulness (Colossians 3:17). Are we allowing ourselves to be aroomed in Christ?

Reflection: There is great significance to the LORD repeating Himself in His Word. In the first two chapters of the book of Job the LORD repeats Himself three times. What do all three of these verses have in common? How does the LORD describe His servant Job? What can you learn from these verses?

The intensity of evil all around us is growing in this present day. One of the characteristics of Job was that he eschewed evil. To eschew evil means that he turned from it, he departed from, he avoided it, withdrew from it, etc...

Challenge: As you seek to eschew evil in your life, you will in the eyes of the Lord, be seen as upright. Eschewing evil will demand that you take a stand against the culture. Are you ready?
