WHEN A GODLY MAN REIGNS

King Solomon reigned over all Israel

"So king Solomon was king over all Israel." (I Kings 4:1)

The Scripture records God's summary of the character of King Solomon's reign over Israel. In this brief, God-given record we learn what a godly man's reign can bring to a society with God's help.

1. It brings merriment - Eating and drinking and making merry

I Kings 4:20: Judah and Israel were many, as the sand which is by the sea in multitude, eating and drinking, and making merry.

2. It brings stability - Dominion over all the region

I Kings 4:24: For he had dominion over all the region on this side the river, from Tiphsah even to Azzah, over all the kings on this side the river: and he had peace on all sides round about him.

3. It brings safety and tranquility - Dwelt in safety

I Kings 4:25: And Judah and Israel dwelt safely, every man under his vine and under his fig tree, from Dan even to Beer-sheba, all the days of Solomon.

4. It brings prosperity - Lacked nothing

I Kings 4:27: And those officers provided victual for king Solomon, and for all that came unto king Solomon's table, every man in his month: they lacked nothing.

5. It brings God's blessing - God gave wisdom, understanding and largeness of heart

I Kings 4:29: And God gave Solomon wisdom and understanding exceeding much, and largeness of heart, even as the sand that is on the sea shore.

6. It brings opportunity for an Increase of Literature and Music



DOES EKKLESIA HAVE TWO MEANINGS?

"The essence of a church is that it assembles. It isn't an assembly without assembling." Simple, profound, true! I committed myself theologically and personally to this truth years ago in a Protestant seminary when the Greek and New Testament Professor averred, "Men, in the secular Greek world of the first century ekklesia meant exclusively 'visible assembly.' However, the Holy Spirit gave ekklesia another second meaning— 'universal invisible assembly' in Mt. 16:18." I can understand why Roman Catholics, Protestants, and Fundamental Baptists want to perpetuate the Ignatian mantra "wherever Jesus Christ is, there is the catholic [universal] church." However, the Scripture warns about mixing philosophy including Platonism with truth, saying, "Neither give heed to fables and endless genealogies, which minister questions, rather than godly edifying which is in faith: so do" (I Tim. 1:4; cf. also Col. 2:8-11). Plato held that "true reality" was in the universal invisible realm of everything local and visible. The neo-platonists "church fathers" forced this Gnostic premise on the word ekklesia as evinced by Ignatius. Hence, Christianity accepted the two definitions for "church" without Scripture and has perpetuated this heresy for centuries.

Today, the majority of Christendom holds to two meanings for "church": a visible local church and an invisible universal church. For those pastors who have chosen not to assemble they may now soothe their consciences by positing the "second notion" for church—the unassembled assembly. However, those not assembling but live-streaming or using other media are not "having church" since biblically the synonymous words "church," ekklesia, "assembly" can mean only an assembled assembly. The assembled assembly (obvious repetition) is the only place where the Head of the church, the Lord Jesus Christ meets with His baptized church members (Mt. 18:20) and authorizes the practice of the two ordinances of Baptism and the Lord's Table through the bishop or overseer of the visible assembled assembly (I Tim. 3:1-15). Furthermore, if there are two definitions for "church" why go back to the assembled assembly definition and practice? Think of the ingenious ways to inaugurate the virtual practices for the ordinances of Baptism and of the Lord's Supper. Churches could save money on mortgages or rent and Baptists church members could save on travel expenses!

This is not the time to change doctrine to fit soft Christianity, especially in Baptist circles. The unassembled church members of an ekklesia are no more the "church" than scattered sheep are the flock. One scattered sheep does not constitute the flock anymore than church members at home constitute the "church." The shepherd must search, find, and bring the scattered sheep back to the safety of the flock. When the assembly is not assembled there is no spiritual, and by extension, no physical safety for the members (I

Cor. 11:30). Furthermore, as all pastors should know, church members DO NOT grow spiritually when they don't meet regularly with the Lord in His designated place on His designated day. Peter enjoined the scattered Jews who started churches in Asia Minor to "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ" (II Pet. 3:18). Some are saying "pray and trust God" during this time, while not assembling. This is just as empty as if the ten spies who discouraged Israel about obeying Jehovah were to say, "Let's not go into the Promised Land because of dangerous obstacles but we can still pray and trust God"! Where is the faith of Job, who said, "though he slay me, yet will I trust in him"?

IT IS NOT THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PASTOR TO PROTECT HIS FLOCK FROM DEATH, BUT TO PREPARE HIS FLOCK FOR DEATH!

The Apostle Peter did indeed deal with submission to authority, instructing the *diaspora* churches to practice obedience to human authorities including government, masters, and unsaved husbands (I Pet. 2:13-3:6 [contra Acts 5:29]). However, there are exceptions to submission in these cases if government violates the opportunity for believers to worship Jehovah, or if masters or unsaved husbands demand unethical, dishonest, illegal, or immoral behaviour. Is there ever a time to disobey government, masters, or unsaved husbands? Yes! Is there ever a time to disobey the Lord Jesus Christ? No, never!

The secular world has caught onto the dictatorial government overreach in the name of COVID-19 and has begun to claim civil liberties and to call out churches for not standing for the First Amendment. The Lord made no exception clause for COVID-19 when He declared directly and simply, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's" (Mk. 12:17). Soon shame and embarrassment will overtake some pastors and church members who have been deceived by the narrative "stay home, stay safe [for the good of mankind]" as the shutdown goes on and on and on. Now is the time for Baptist shepherds to seek out the wandering sheep (albeit given limited liberty) and bring them back into the fold in a kind and gracious way. David looked to his Shepherd and said, "I have gone astray like a lost sheep; seek thy servant; for I do not forget thy commandments" (Ps. 119:176).
