NAS: "And by common confession great is the mystery of godliness: **He** who was revealed in the **flesh.**"

NIV: "Beyond all question, the mystery of godliness is great: He appeared in a body."

RSV: "Great indeed, we confess, is the mystery of our religion: He was manifested in the flesh."

DEVOTIONAL CORNER



AN AMBASSADOR

"Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, and Timotheus our brother, To the saints and faithful brethren in Christ which are at Colosse: Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ"

Colossians 1:1-2

Pastor Cas Reeves Paul introduces himself as "an apostle of Jesus Christ" as he begins his letter to the saints at Colosse. In most of Paul's letters, he reveals his apostleship in the introduction of the letter. The word "apostle" means "one who is sent." It is also a reference to the early church's apostolic office, which was a gift to the Lord's church for promotion and edification of His body. This office ended with the death of the last apostle.

The Apostle was sent forth to carry out the commission which the Lord gave to His church. That commission is found in Matthew 29:19-20, also in Acts 1:8.

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (Matthew 28:19-20)

"But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Thus, the Apostles traveled from country to country, nation to nation, province to province, city to city, and village to village sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. As they evangelized individuals, they baptized them and discipled them, making them followers of Jesus and teaching them to observe all thing which Christ commanded. These disciples were assembled to carry out the commission after the pattern of the apostles. This assembly was called a local church.

In reality, the Apostolic office represented the initial ambassadors of Christ. It was their duty to represent Christ and His work. Although the Apostolic office has been discontinued, the great commission is still in effect and belongs to the local church, which is the body. Now, it is the church members that continue to carry out this duty.



THE SERVANTS RESPONSE PART 1

Read: Matthew 18:23-50

Matthew 18:26 The servant therefore fell down, and worshipped him, saying, Lord, have patience with me, and I will pay thee all.

27 Then the lord of that servant was moved with compassion, and loosed him, and forgave him the debt.

Reflection: As we read in this parable, the servant is in debt to the king and is now required to pay. There are several responses that this servant could have had, can you think of 2 or 3?

- *Apathy-just didn't care what happened to himself or his family
- *Renegotiating-try to bargain down his debt
- *Blaming-it was the fault of another he didn't have the money
- *Excuses-he tried to pay the debt but life happened

What **is** this servants response? He is humble, worships, asks for mercy, and has a desire to be right with the king of the kingdom.

What is the king's response? What a wonderful and compassionate king. He sees the hopeless condition of this servant and let him free of the debt and forgave it as though it never existed.

Challenge: When we see our condition of sinfulness against our Heavenly Father and our response is humility, and wanting a right relationship with Him...our Father also has compassion on us and forgives our debt through the wonderful redemption offered by our Lord and King Jesus Christ.


Acts 20:21 Testifying both to the Jews, and also to the Greeks, repentance toward God, and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ.
