On Friday, April 17, 2020, BBC will host the eleventh annual BBTS Spring Lecture Series entitled:

"I will joy in the God of my salvation" BIBLICAL SOTERIOLOGY

Dr. Thomas Strouse will deal with the biblical doctrine of Salvation (Soteriology), including the doctrine of Man (Anthropology), and the doctrine of Sin (Hamartiology). Soteriology will focus on need for salvation, the conditions for salvation, the Person of salvation, the terms relating of salvation, the fruit of salvation, and the Book of Life, which understanding refutes theological systems such as Calvinism and Arminianism. Anthropology will describe the origin, character, unity, constitution, and fall of man. Hamartiology will cover the character, terms, definition, origin, universality, and extent of sin and its remedy. The Lectures will be held at the Courtyard Marriott in Cromwell, CT. THE HEART The heart is to keep the commandments for length of days and long life:

Proverbs 3:1-2: "My son, forget not my law; but let thine heart keep my commandments: For length of days, and long life, and peace, shall they add to thee."

The heart when associated with mercy and truth builds relationships:

Pastor Cas Reeves Proverbs 3:3-4: "Let not mercy and truth forsake thee: bind them about thy neck; write them upon the table of thine heart: So shalt thou find favour and good understanding in the sight of God and man."

The heart when it trust the Lord can give you direction in life: *Proverbs 3:5-6: "Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths."*

The heart determines the issues (out goings) of life: Proverbs 4:23: "Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life."

The heart is froward (unruly):

Proverbs 6:14: "Frowardness is in his heart, he deviseth mischief continually; he soweth discord."

The heart devises wicked imaginations:

Proverbs 6:18-19: "An heart that deviseth wicked imaginations, feet that be swift in running to mischief, A false witness that speaketh lies, and he that soweth discord among brethren."

The heart gives direction when commandments are bound to the heart:

Proverbs 6:21-22: "Bind them (commandments) continually upon thine heart, and tie them about thy neck. When thou goest, it shall lead thee; when thou sleepest, it shall keep thee; and when thou awakest, it shall talk with thee."

The heart is lustful:

Proverbs 6:25: "Lust not after her beauty in thine heart; neither let her take thee with her eyelids."

The heart can receive commandments: Proverbs 10:8: "The wise in heart will receive commandments: but a prating fool shall fall."

The heart that is perverse shall be despised:

Proverbs 12:8: "A man shall be commended according to his wisdom: but he that is of a perverse heart shall be despised."

WORLDLY SORROW

Read Matthew 18:23-50

Matthew 18:28 But the same servant went out, and found one of his fellowservants, which owed him an hundred pence: and he laid hands on him, and took him by the throat, saying, Pay me that thou owest.

29 And his fellowservant fell down at his feet, and besought him, saying, Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all.

30 And he would not: but went and cast him into prison, till he should pay the debt.

Reflection: What is your reaction when you read this about the same servant? This servant forgot the compassion and forgiveness that he received, did he think he was better and more superior than his fellowservant, his eyes were on himself and the mammon of this world.

Matthew 6:24 No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.

Sadly, this servant had a hardened heart of bitterness and did not reflect the heart of his king. This leaves us wondering: Was this same servant genuine in his falling down and worshiping? Did he truly have a repentant heart or did he have worldly sorrow?

2 Corinthians 7:10 For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death.

The King did forgive him his debt, so another question would be, was he walking in the flesh? It is very possible for believers to walk unworthily. Nevertheless, it was a poor testimony of a converted heart that should reflect grace and forgiveness toward others.

In the following verse, the Church at Ephesus was instructed to apply grace and forgiveness toward others, because they were on the receiving end of forgiveness for their great debt of sin.

Ephesians 4:32 And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

Challenge: Are we then also to practice Ephesians 4:32? Are there ways in which you see yourself in this servant? Are there times you behave like this servant toward a husband, a parent, a son or daughter, a church member, or those with which you work? Does the Holy Ghost bring to mind someone with whom you are needing to exercise compassion and the heart of Christ?


