uring the week of June 6-10, 2022, Dr. Thomas Strouse taught the *Johannine Epistles* for the seminary module at Community Baptist Church in Cooperstown, PA. Dr. David Smith is the pastor of the church and encouraged his people to attend, of whom about thirty enrolled in class or watched on "live stream." The students learned that the backdrop of the New Testament world was engulfed in Gnosticism which

penetrated many churches through various false teachers with damnable heresies. First John dealt with the problem of Gnostic *church members*, Second John dealt with the problem of Gnostic *church missionaries*, and Third John dealt with the problem of Gnostic *church ministers*.



THE LORD ADDED TO THE CHURCH-VOL. 3 COMPLETED

r. Thomas Strouse is pleased to announce that the Third Volume of his three volume commentary on *The Lord Added to the Church. A Commentary on the Acts of the*



Apostles (Chapters Twenty through Twenty-Eight) is finished and ready for printing. This last volume contains 609 pages with four appendices. The three volume set has a total of 1948 pages and 6718 footnotes, giving a commentary on the English and Greek texts of the King James Version. This commentary is the product of about three and a half years of daily study of and writing about the second work addressed to Theophilus from the physician Luke, the Book of Acts.

The commentary is an effort to help pastors and church members have a better understanding of the *Book of Acts*, including difficult passages and interpretative issues. This commentary refutes Protestant eisegesis and parachurch assumptions with biblical ecclesiology. The First Volume covered Chapters One through Nine, and the Second Volume dealt with Chapters Ten through Nineteen. The Bibliography contains over two hundred and fifty

entries of relevant works, old and new, on the *Book of Acts*. The Lord Added to the Church. A Commentary on the Acts of the Apostles (Chapters Twenty through Twenty-Eight) should be available by mid-summer, 2022.

ENCOURAGEMENT IN FAITH

"But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him." Hebrews 11:6

The Bible is very clear; in order to please God one must have a Bible faith. Bible faith is a faith that comes from the words of God. The Apostle Paul reveals, "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by

the word of God" (Romans 10:17). It is simply a faith that takes God at His word. A faithful person is one who receives God's word by believing and observes God's word by believing.


The measure of one's faith is usually the measure of how well or acceptable he observes what he believes regarding that which God has revealed to him from the Scriptures. There are many Christians who have been discouraged because of their personal evaluation regarding the weakness of their faith. As a result many beat themselves for it and tend to live their Christian life in a weak state not allowing themselves the help of God to strengthen them because they seem so unworthy.

The Christian needs only to read the book of Judges to find Godly people who were weak in their personal faith as God unfolds their accounts. Yet one notes how God used men like Barak, Gideon, and Samson. These were men that all had faith issues in their lives: Barak, who needed the strength of Deborah's faith to accomplish his task; Gideon, who needed sign after sign in order to believe God was really with him in his task; and Samson, who was more worldly than faithful, whose eye was always wondering, but who at the end of his life called upon God by faith to gloriously glorified God in the finishing victoriously his task.

As one evaluates the commonalties of each of these men: first, they each had their own personal problems in faith, which causes one to surmise they were weak in their faith. Secondly, regardless of the measure of their faith, they attempted by faith to do what God had asked them to do. Thirdly, even though these men struggled internally with their particular faith issues, they accomplished what God asked them to do; they were willing to let God use them. And fourthly, all three of these men are mentioned in God's Hall of Faith: "And what shall I more say? for the time would fail me to tell of Gideon, and of Barak, and of Samson...," (Hebrews 11:32).

Beloved, the most important evaluation of the Believer's faith is God's evaluation. Let each of us be encouraged that even though we may judge ourselves to be weak in faith, God can use us, if we will let Him. -CAR
