
BBTS Launches Fall Classes

Before Time -There Was Social Behavior by Pastor Cas Reeves

DEVOTIONAL CORNER

Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever thou hadst formed the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God

IV

Psalm 90:2

We think in time. We have seen the beginning of things and the end of things. Our mind is able to



understand the concept of time. On the other hand, the concept of the eternal or everlasting is a difficult concept for us to grasp, other than, "it means forever." The Bible tells us that God is "from everlasting to everlasting." God has always been and God will always

be. In other words, God was be-

fore time and He will be after time. He is everlasting.

The importance of everlasting is found throughout the Word of God. But its significance can readily be seen in the Godhead: The

Father, Son and Holy Ghost. With in the parameters of the Godhead, we see an eternal social relationship. The Godhead being eternal, therefore, makes social relationship something that existed before time. Note: *In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth* (Genesis 1:1). Creation was the work of the Godhead: *And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the*

Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. And God said, Let there be light: and there was light.

And God said, Let there be light, and there was light. And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness. And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day (Genesis 1:2-5). Here, we see the creation of light and time, as the Spirit moved and God spoke in unison. Later in social conversation, we are told of their conclusion: And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness (Genesis 1:26). Regarding Jesus the Son of God and creation, we are told: For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him (Colossians 1:16).

This brings us to the first point. God did not have to create man because he was lonely and needed fellowship. Fellowship or social intercourse existed in God before creation and therefore before time. God was not lonely, and longing for conversation with others.

He is everlasting, and therefore had and has eternal communion within the Godhead. Social intercourse, therefore, is a part of the eternal nature and essence of

> God. The second point, brings us to the dignity of man in his social relationships. Having been created in the likeness of God, we find that our nature calls out for social communion with others. Because this social nature is rooted in God, it can only truly be fulfilled with God and God's way. For eternal fellowship: Jesus saith unto him, I am

the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me (John 14:6). And for present social intercourse: But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation (1 Peter 1:15). Before time there was social behavior, and that behavior was holy and godly. Therefore as a Believer, who is living for eternity, our present social behavior with others should dignify our Christian position and our created likeness in God. This social behavior is called godliness. -CAR





SERMON OUTLINE

A Prophet is Not Without Honor

Dr. Thomas M. Strouse, Pastor

Introduction: The Lord Jesus taught the 12 by parables, miracles, and now about rejection. Unbelief in Nazareth (for the second time [cf. Lk. 4:18 ff.]) caused several results:

I. They Dismissed His Person (vv. 1-3)

- A. His occupation--a carpenter
- B. His parents--son of Mary (and illegitimate -Jn. 8:41)
- C. His family--no standouts

II. They Dishonored His Office (v. 4)

- A. He was a Prophet (Dt. 18:15; Acts 3:22)
- B. He was dishonored in Nazareth for the second and last time (Lk. 4:18 ff.).

III. They Diminished His Work (vv. 5-6)

- A. He did mighty works in the region (v. 2)
- B. He did not mighty works in Nazareth because of their unbelief (He was both the revealed and concealed Christ)

Conclusion: There is great accountability for the light and truth revealed. When the Bible truth is rejected, Christ becomes more concealed to the unsaved and to Christians!
