### APOSTASY

### **INTRODUCTION**

The word *apostasia* occurs twice in the NT, translated "*forsake*" (Acts 21:21) and "*a falling away*" (II Thes. 2:3). The Greek verb *apostatono* does not appear in the NT but it means "to stand from (the truth)" and anglicized "to apostatize." Christianity in general and Fundamentalism in specific posit the popular view that the rank liberals who deny the deity of Christ and virgin birth are the only ones who apostatize. However, the contextual use and application of Scripture reveal that "the standing from or turning away from truth" is the characteristic of God's creation. The LORD created angels during the creation week and immediately afterward perfect Lucifer and a third of the perfect angels apostatized. The Lord GOD created man on the sixth day and immediately after that day perfect Adam and Eve apostatized. God created a perfect creation with perfect creatures to make moral choices and His creation apostatize. Does the imperfect church member or pastor think that he cannot apostatize?<sup>1</sup> The first step in apostasy is the denial that it could happen to "even me!"

### **NEW TESTAMENT APPLICATION**

Apparently the NT writers believed that Baptist church members could and would apostatize, and warned churches accordingly. For instance, Paul warned the Ephesian elders that some of their own pastoral staff would apostatize, saying, "For I know this, that after my departing shall grievous wolves enter in among you, not sparing the flock. Also of your own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them" (Acts 20:29-30). Later, the Apostle John condemned the apostate elder Diotrephes, perhaps the pastor of the Ephesian church (III Jn. 1:9-11). Peter and Barnabas, pillars of the Jerusalem church, behaved hypocritically concerning eating with Gentiles and received strong renunciation from Paul (Gal. 2:9-14). Hymenaeus and Philetus mocked the resurrection doctrine (II Tim. 2:17-18) and the experienced Demas loved the world and forsook Paul (II Tim. 4:10). Apostasy begins in the heart and manifests with the tongue even with the tongue grieved the Holy Spirit (Eph. 4:29-32).

Both Peter and Jude warned their respective congregations about apostasy. With great similarities they warned these Jewish churches about the apostasy beginning with apostate angels, then apostate mankind, then apostate sodomites, and then apostate false teachers and church members potentially in the assemblies (II Pet. 2:1-22; Jude 1:1-25). In fact, Peter advised church members to grow in sanctification by adding spiritual qualities to their lives or become spiritually blind (II Pet. 1:5-9) and return to the vomit of the adamic nature as did Lot (II Pet. 2:22). Interestingly, Peter was one of the ten who was first to be indwelt and regenerated (Jn. 20:22) and

shortly thereafter these regenerated apostles turned from the Lord and His will in their apostasy and went "*a fishing*" (Jn. 21:3). Paul revealed that church members must be filled continually with the Spirit (Eph. 5:18),<sup>2</sup> being led by the Spirit (and not sinning [Rom. 8:14; Gal. 5:18]), and displaying the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22-23), and not walking in the work of the flesh (Gal. 5:19-21). Being filled with the Spirit is the status of sinless perfection for which life and ministry we will receive rewards (I Cor. 3:11-15). When we walk in the works of the flesh (of the old man) we will receive the loss of rewards. Being filled with the Spirit is true biblical Lordship salvation! Are we in a status of apostasy or perfection!

### CHALLENGE

In the past year of the divine testing of Covid, how did we respond to obeying the precious Lord Jesus Christ? When exceptions are made to obedience, then apostasy has already begun in the heart. It becomes apparent in the Christian landscape of the world and of America many have apostatized, and the downward slide is spiritually tragic. Pompous pastors who give pious platitudes such as "do right until the stars fall" fail their congregations through their condescending approach that we cannot apostatize because we are not theological liberals. We as pastors need to put some teeth in our preaching by actual obedience in trying times. The Lord warned the pastor/angel/star at Ephesus who *"left"* (apostatized) his first love, and demanded that repentance must begin with him (Rev. 2:4-5)! Let us begin to examine our own hearts.

<sup>2</sup> "And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit; Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord; Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ; Submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God" (Eph. 5:18-21). The believer may gauge his/her status of Spirit-filled living by examining to see if there is present a joyful heart, a thankful heart, and a submissive heart.

# THE LITTLE CONEY

"The conies are but a feeble folk, yet make they their houses in the rocks." Proverbs 30:26

The coney is a rock-badger that lives in the Middle East. King Solomon, the writer of the book of Proverbs, speaks of the coney, associating them along with the ant, the locust and the spider as examples of being small but wise.

The Scripture reveals that the coney is considered an unclean animal for the Israelites (Leviticus 11:5). It is described as a feeble animal (Proverbs 30:26). Because it lives in the rocks to find their protection, the coney is considered wise.

It is wise for the sinner to study the coney's characteristics and to consider how the sinner finds himself with similar characteristics as the coney. The sinner is unclean like the coney. The sinner is feeble like the coney. And the sinner needs a rock protection.

The New Testament teaches the Rock is Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 10:4). The sinner's only hope of eternal protection is the Rock of Christ. Sin brings death, Christ, the Rock, brings life (Romans 6:23). As the coney was wise to hide in the rocks for safety, it is wise for the sinner to hide or trust in the Rock of Christ, who offers the only way to Heaven (John 14:6). -CAR


