# **FALL LECTURE SERIES**

On Friday, Nov. 13, 2020, the Lord willing, Bible Baptist Church will host the Bible Baptist Theological Seminary Fall Lecture Series at Marriot Courtyard in Cromwell, CT from 9AM to 3 PM with a luncheon at 11:30 AM-1:00 PM. A book table will be available with books authored by Bible-believing writers including the excellent work by Dr. Noel Meadowcroft entitled *If Any Man be in Christ*. Also available will be the new work entitled *The Lord Added to the Church. A Commentary on the Acts of the Apostles*, Volume One, by Dr. Thomas M. Strouse, which includes 664 pages and 2221 footnotes chocked full of Greek studies and theological notes. This first Volume will cost \$30.00. Two more Volumes are in the works which should total about 2000 pages of commentary on the Book of Acts.

Since the Marriott will require health and safety protocols, the maximum number of attendees will be up to fifty with social distancing in chairs but with no tables. # LECTURE SERIES—AN EXCERPT

### DR. THOMAS M. STROUSE

The **Lecture Presentation**, entitled "I Will Joy in the God of my Salvation" BIBLICAL SOTERIOLOGY, will be an effort to instruct and encourage believers in a wicked and chaotic world about the blessings of salvation and the need to rejoice in the Saviour.

"About 606 BC, the prophet Habakkuk watched the surrounding nations of Judah fall to the growing threat of the Babylonian army. He recognized that Judah was in the ferocious and brutal swath of King Nebuchadnezzar, knowing that the wicked Judean kings since Josiah were feckless to stop the advance, albeit his people were ripe for judgment. The prophet asked about two problematic situations, namely querying about the unpunished injustice of wicked Judah and about the incredulous employment of the Babylonians to judge the Southern Kingdom. Although Isaiah had predicted the ascension of Babylon and her coming atrocities toward all nations (Isa. 40-66), Habakkuk was dumbfounded that Jehovah would use them to punish His chosen people. The LORD's succinct answer to His prophet was "the just shall live by his faith" (Hab. 2:4; cf. also Rom. 1:17, Gal. 3:11, and Heb. 10:38).

Finally, in his Book, the prophet penned a musical prayer to the chief singer (Hab. 3:1, 19) about his glorious and powerful Marching Warrior and His past victories. Then the poetic prophet concluded with the present realization of the prophecy of the Babylonian advance, recognizing the ultimate destructive devastation of the land, saying, "Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines; the labour of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stalls" (Hab. 3:17). His people, country, city, and Temple were about to be decimated (ultimately in 586 BC). In effect, Habakkuk bemoaned that his whole world was ready to collapse! Nevertheless, he could say, as one living by faith (Hab. 2:4), "Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation" (Hab. 3:18).







While Pastor Strouse was in Pennsylvania teaching, church members Robert Hovey, Ryan Strouse, and Bill Gagnon filled the pulpit during Sunday School, Sunday Morning & Afternoon service, and Wednesday Evening, respectively.

We are told that Solomon was the wisest man in the world.

How did he become so wise? He asked the Lord for the wisdom, and he asked whole heartedly, and out of a pure heart. He did not ask for the purpose of self promotion, but rather for wisdom to lead God's great people, Israel. "And now, O LORD my God, thou hast made thy servant king: and I am but a little child: I know not how to go out or come in. Give therefore thy servant an understanding heart to judge thy people, that I may discern between good and bad: And the speech pleased the Lord, that Solomon had asked this thing. And God said unto him, Because thou hast asked this thing, and hast not asked for thyself; but hast asked for thyself understanding to discern judgment; Behold, I have done according to thy words: lo, I have given thee a wise and an understanding heart; so that there was none like thee before thee, neither after thee shall any arise like unto thee" (1 Kings 3:7-12).

olomon as our example: Can we have this wisdom today? We are exhorted, "If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that

giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him" (James 1:5). Like Solomon we must ask for wisdom. This wisdom is described as, "wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy" (James 3:17). Again, like Solomon we must ask for the right wisdom.

here are three important necessities with "heaven-found" wisdom. necessities must be present in order to have Godly wisdom. First, We need to have a fear of God, which is the same as being saved. "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge" (Proverbs 1:7). Second, we need to have the Word of God. "For the Lord giveth wisdom: out of his mouth cometh knowledge and understanding" (Proverbs 2:6). And the third, we need the indwelling of the Holy Spirit as a teacher; "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth:" (John 16:13). King Solomon possessed all three of these necessities. And just as God was pleased with Solomon; so, God is pleased with us, when our desires for wisdom are the same as was Solomon's desire. -CAR
